ENGLISH <i>Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC) Articles 3, 13, 17, 20, 28, 29, 31 & 42</i>	<u>Philosophical thinking:</u> Can you put a price on human life? How do we decide how much a life is worth? What qualities do we value in human beings? How much are we in control of our own lives? What does happiness look like? Is blood thicker than water? Should we always forgive and forget? When should children voice their opinions? What are rights and responsibilities? How do you define home? What does it mean 'to be cruel to be kind'? Is anyone truly evil? (Or do they do evil things?) The children will experience various different types of writing through reading <i>Spilled Water</i> as our key text. They will learn about the area the story is set in, and the struggles of being a girl there. Furthermore, the children will develop their understanding of letters and creative writing. Throughout the term the children will explore and discuss many reading themes and key questions around the larger ideas within the text, such as; Should everyone be treated equally? What are our human rights and responsibilities? and What do humans need to be happy? These are just a few of the key themes that children will be discussing as we work through this text. It will also help the children to develop their ongoing understanding of the UNICEF Rights Respecting Schools.	
MATHS <i>CRC Articles 28, 29</i>	<u>Number and Place Value:</u> The children will develop their ability to read, write, order and compare numbers to 1 000 000 and determine the value of each digit. They will further their rounding ability of any number up to 1 000 000 to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000 and apply this knowledge to solve number and practical problems. <u>Addition and Subtraction:</u> The children will apply previous knowledge learnt in Year 4 to add and subtract numbers with more than 4-digits using column method, as well as mental strategies. They will use rounding and the inverse to determine the accuracy of their answers and apply this to problem solving.	<u>Multiplication and Division:</u> The children will continue to apply and practise the multiplication tables and division facts to help them identify multiples and all factor pairs of a number, including common factors of two numbers. They will develop their vocabulary of prime and composite numbers. The children will multiply and divide whole numbers using written and mental strategies and apply this to solve problems.
SCIENCE <i>CRC Articles 28, 29</i>	<u>Properties and Changes of Materials</u> In this unit, children will compare and group together everyday materials by their properties, including their hardness, solubility, transparency, conductivity (electrical and thermal), and response to magnets. They will know that some materials will dissolve in liquid to form a solution, and describe how to recover a substance from a	<u>Forces</u> The children will explore falling objects and raise questions about the effects of air resistance. They will do this through observing how different objects, such as parachutes and sycamore seeds, fall. They will experience forces that make things begin to move, get faster or slow down, and explore the effects of friction on movement and find out

The children will work scientifically, making predictions about the time objects will take to fall to the ground, and record this scientifically in a well-written investigation.
COMPUTING <i>CRC Articles</i> 17, 28, 29	<u>Computer Science 1</u> The children will be using <i>Scratch</i> and iPad OR <i>Espresso Coding</i> this term to design a Maths quiz	<u>Computer Science 2</u> The children will be using shapes, lines, rotation, sizing etc. to create drawings in <i>Publisher</i>
HISTORY <i>CRC Articles</i> 13, 28, 29	<u>The Tudors</u> The children will learn about the rise of one of the most enduring dynasties of English monarchs: the Tudors. This unit focuses on the War of the Roses, Henry VII's defeat of Richard III and the bringing together of two feuding families: Lancaster and York.	
GEOGRAPHY <i>CRC Articles</i> 24, 28, 29		<u>Rivers</u> Children will learn how rivers are formed, using the key features of a river and explain the inter-relationship between the river processes of erosion, transportation and deposition of materials. They will research famous rivers in the world and compare them to the River Thames. The children will then go on to exploring the advantages and disadvantages of living near rivers.
DESIGN TECHNOLOGY <i>CRC Articles</i> 28, 29, 31		<u>Electrical Systems</u> In DT this half term, the children will be looking at more complex circuits and switches. They will be exploring how to programme and control them.
ART <i>CRC Articles</i> 28, 29, 31	<u>Self-Portraits</u> The children will learn how to draw a face, paying attention to dimensions, and they will practise sketching the main features of their own faces. This term, the children will explore Tudor portraits of Holbein – understanding his role and the mood created by his paintings.

MUSIC <i>CRC Articles 17, 28, 29</i>	This term, the Year 5 children will start learning how to play the recorders. They will be learning how to control their breathing and how to read musical notes to a variety of musical genres, including Jazz, Pop, Rock and Classical. They will be composing, and continue to learn how to use musical notation to write their own songs. They will play as an ensemble and will have the opportunity to play solo as well.

They will also learn how to conjugate the verb 'to study', an introduction to time and an expansion of opinions. By the end of the unit, pupils will have the knowledge and skills to talk about the subjects they like and dislike at school (along with a justification) and at what time / day they study various subjects. This will enable pupils to create more detailed and personalised responses by the end of the unit.	<u>My Home</u> MI CASA By the end of this unit, pupils will have the knowledge and skills to present both orally and in written form about where they live and which rooms they have and do not have in their homes, in Spanish. This is a unit that focuses on recycling previously learnt grammar, using it with new vocabulary, conjunctions and grammar, demonstrating a growing ability to create independent responses.
