London Children's Literature Festival

Year 6 had a fantastic opportunity to attend the **London Children's Literature Festival** at **The Hackney Empire**, where they had the privilege to hear from **Onjali Q. Raúf**, author of ***The Boy at the Back of the Class***. Onjali is not only a bestselling children's writer but also a passionate activist who has worked extensively to support refugees through her charity work. Her experiences of helping refugee families inspired many of her stories and has encouraged our pupils to think about empathy, kindness and the importance of welcoming others.

The children were also lucky to meet **Joseph Coelho**, an **award-winning poet, playwright and former UK Children's Laureate**. Joseph shared his love of poetry and storytelling through an engaging and interactive workshop, inspiring our pupils to experiment with language, rhythm and performance. His enthusiasm encouraged everyone to see poetry as something creative, enjoyable and accessible.

A highlight of the day was the opportunity to have books signed by both authors, creating lasting memories and inspiring our pupils to continue their reading and writing journeys.

The children then enjoyed meeting a variety of farm animals, including goats, sheep, rabbits, guinea pigs, and tortoises.

Year 3

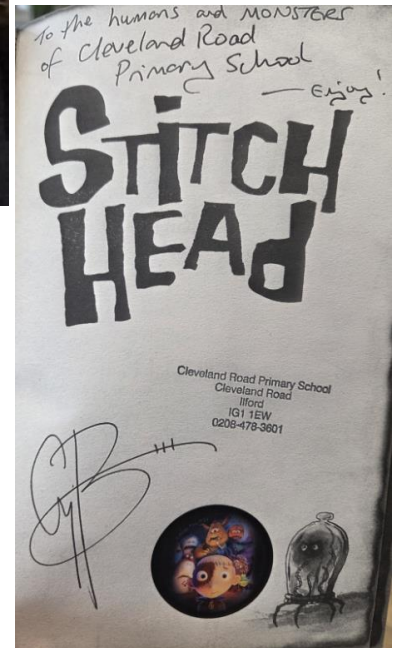

Year 4

Our Year 4 artists have been incredibly busy this half-term exploring the ancient Indonesian art form of **Batik**. As part of their current Art and Design topic, the learners have been developing their fine motor skills and patience by learning all about **wax-resist fabric dyeing techniques**.

The project began with our learners researching the **cultural history of Batik** and looking at traditional geometric and nature-inspired patterns. After designing their own unique templates in their sketchbooks, it was time to get messy! Using fabric, the children carefully applied a liquid resist material over their pencil lines to seal the fabric.

Once dry, the classrooms transformed into a sea of colour. The children mixed and applied vibrant textile paints and dyes, watching in amazement as the covered lines "resisted" the colour to leave striking white outlines behind.

Our young creators showed fantastic resilience throughout this multi-step process. The final, colourful masterpieces look absolutely stunning and will soon be proudly displayed outside the classrooms.

A huge well done to Year 4 for their brilliant focus and boundless creativity!
